


More than \$26 million

Achievement Award

Incoming full-time and part-time students enrolled in a degree program with a 2.50 grade point average (GPA) or higher will be considered for an award. Full-time students can receive up to \$8,000 per standard academic year based on GPA and date of application submission or readmitting effective date. Part-time students can receive up to 15 percent off tuition per standard academic year based on GPA and credit load. Deadline for the Winter 2026 term is October 6, 2025. Deadline for the Spring 2026 term is February 2, 2026.

Alumni Legacy Scholarship

A scholarship up to 30 percent may be awarded to full-time students in a degree program who have had at least one parent, grandparent, or legal guardian graduate from Berkeley College.

Berkeley College Grant

The amounts for this grant vary based on need and enrollment status. Students must maintain a cumulative Berkeley College GPA of 1.50 or higher at the end of each award year to retain their grant and maintain satisfactory academic progress.

Corporate Learning Partnership

Through the Corporate Learning Partnership program, employees of member organizations may be eligible for up to a 30 percent tuition reduction for themselves and their immediate family members toward online and on-site degree programs. Not all programs are eligible for this reduction opportunity.

Honors Scholarship

2026 high school graduates who are accepted to the Honors Program may receive up to a half-tuition scholarship based on their high school GPA of 3.50 or higher and review of transcript by the Honors Committee. Students must meet all federal and state grant application deadlines each year and receive a valid Institutional Student Information Report (ISIR). Deadline to apply is June 1, 2026.

Presidential Scholarship

Each campus awards one student a full tuition scholarship each academic year. All other eligible students may receive up to a 30 percent tuition scholarship. All awards are based on high school GPA. First-time students enrolled in a degree program must complete all admissions requirements by December 15, 2025, to be considered for this scholarship.

Transfer Opportunity Program Grant (TOP)

This up to 50 percent tuition grant is open to eligible students who enroll full-time in one of Berkeley's Bachelor's degree programs after receiving an Associate's degree from an accredited United States college (other than Berkeley College).

Yellow Ribbon Grant

Awarded to veterans enrolled in a degree program who have 100 percent Post-9/11 GI Bill® eligibility. Students receive 50 percent of the remaining tuition balance after all benefits have been applied.

Berkeley College need-based grant awards are determined after all federal grants, Post-9/11 GI Bill® amounts, state grants, state scholarships, Berkeley College grants and scholarships (not need-based), outside resources (such as private scholarships, VA benefits other than Post-9/11 GI Bill®, tuition reimbursement, etc.), and federal subsidized loans have been applied.
